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
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# Dhi Artspace's Photo Exhibition 'A Letter from My Homeland'

Five individuals, hailing from five geographical locations (Bangladesh, India, Iran, Nepal and Pakistan), have found distinct ways to represent their respective homeland from an insider's perspective. The lens that captures the moments is, more often than not, compassionate, poetic and that of a flâneur. This approach makes each place a coveted one to dwell, as Roland Barthes writes in his seminal book, Camera Lucida, "For me, Photographs of landscape (urban or country) must be habitable, not visitable." It can be said, therefore, that the homeland shapes the artist's identity and vice versa.

The participants of the exhibition are Abdul Musawir Shabbir of Pakistan, Binaya Humagain of Nepal, Mohsen Sakha of Iran, Naim Ul Hasan of Bangladesh, Pallov Saikia of India. The curator of the program is Somedutta Mallik of Dhi ArtSpace.

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
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
